Centre Policy For Family Information:**MINIMISING USE OF TOXIC PRODUCTS****Rationale:**

Using toxic or potentially harmful products can pose serious health and safety risks for all those who come into the premises and those who use them. We want to maintain high hygiene and cleanliness standards and ensure cleaning products eliminate germs and potentially infectious materials as well.

Aim:

To reduce the toxic or potentially dangerous products kept on the premises, whilst still meeting the hygiene and disinfection needs of the Centre.

Practices:

- Use least toxic or non-toxic cleaning products. Products containing solvents, fragrances, caustics and chlorinated compounds are not necessary for normal sanitation. In our rooms use Orange Squirt, an organic product.
- Spray product directly onto sponge, away from children to minimise air borne product.
- Toys and equipment are cleaned in hot soapy water, away from child access and air dried.
- Avoid the use of air fresheners, automatic aerosol dispensers; plug in air fresheners and air fresheners in air conditioning systems.
- Do not clean immediately before start of day. Each day wash floors and desk tops to maintain good general hygiene and help minimize levels of airborne bacteria.
- Reduce dust levels. Vacuum daily with a quality vacuum. Install floor mats at all entry doors to reduce levels of shoe borne contaminants inside buildings.
- To deter pests and vermin will ensure we keep food sources limited to designated areas, keep desks, lockers, flooring clear of food residues, removal of wastes at the end of each day and use of screens and trap devices.
- Conduct ongoing investigations into more natural products and tools for cleaning
